Partner-In-Education News ... Carver Middle School was one of two middle schools recognized in the State of Oklahoma as a 2011 Blue Ribbon School. Read Principal, Dr. Melissa Woolridge's letter for more details!

Dear Rev. Anthony Scott and First positive praises to their sons and daughters Baptist Church North Tulsa,

This year Carver was recognized as a 2011 National Blue Ribbon School. The National Blue Ribbon Schools Program honors both public and private elementary, middle and high schools that are either high performing or have improved student achievement to high levels, especially among disadvantaged students. Essentially, the program is part of the United States' Department of Education's effort to identify and share knowledge about the best school leadership and teaching practices.

To be recognized on a national level is a major accomplishment; but, one has to ask-What exactly does the National Blue Ribbon award mean? Speaking from the heart, it means: Carver students stayed up an extra hour to complete what seemed to be an impossible homework assignment; that parents offered verbal assurances and

as they worked meticulously on Math, Science, English, Geography and other elective course assignment; that teachers spent many additional hours tutoring their students and/or working supplemental assignments to reinforce what was being taught in his/her classrooms; that the custodians made sure the building was open early and well into the evening hours for everyone to complete the tasks at hand; that the Carver PTSA and the Carver Foundation met late into the evening hours to finalize plans that would assist with the advancement of Carver students; that former Carver students sent words of encouragement to their former teachers and classmates reminding them about the pride Principal, Melissa J. Woolridge, Ph.D. and the heritage of their school; and that Carver's Partners in Education responded positively, when asked to assist.

Life's Transformaton: Promise, Perpetuity, and Presence Matthew 16:18-19

Pastor's Corner



"This passage has been for many centuries a battleground of theological controversies." (B.H. Carroll) It raises three most important and perennial questions: What is the church, Who established it and when, and What is the foundation? In order to remain true to our inherent nature of being Christ-Centered, these questions must be answered and held to without reservation.

Loosely translated, the New Testament word for church (ecclesia) is an organized assembly whose members have been properly called out from private homes and businesses to attend to public affairs. Used more specifically, it applies to the New Testament assembly. To this assembly, Christ makes two wonderful promises of perpetuity and presence.

Perpetuity, meaning perpetual existence -- In fact, three indisputable conclusions can be drawn from this promise. First, many of its members who have been called out are now in heaven, secondly, many of them who have been called out are here on earth, and thirdly, an indefinite number are yet to be called out and are neither in heaven or on earth because they are yet unborn. Meaning, in God's purposes and plans, the assembly exists now, and also in our conceptions and anticipations.

Christ guarantees not only our perpetual existence, but also His perpetual presence. He is with us as we gather and will remain with us unto the end of the age and throughout eternity. We keep these truths in mind as we celebrate 112 historical years while embracing the opportunities that lie providentially ahead.
